CSL launches Hong Kong's first "Block-the-blocker" Service on mobile network, enabling 1O1O and One2Free customers to reject anonymous callers and enjoy more control of incoming calls and greater privacy.

Hong Kong's First "Block-the-blocker" Service on Mobile Network

With CSL's new "Block-the-blocker" Service, blocked calls will be routed to an announcement advising the callers that the people they want to reach do not wish to receive anonymous calls, so the callers must show their numbers. The "Block-the-blocker" Service effectively reduces unwanted calls and rejects anonymous callers. It is particularly useful for 1O1O or One2Free customers who travel frequently in reducing unnecessary roaming expenses.

The "Block-the-blocker Service" is Easy to Use

To enjoy CSL's "Block-the-blocker" Service, 1O1O and One2Free customers can simply press \*136# [SEND] via their handsets to switch on or switch off the service anytime, anywhere. The service fee is only \$8 per month.
